A facility where children can play freely with toys and picture books, and where parents and guardians can have childcare consultations. Babies (under I years old) visiting the facility for the first time will receive a lunchbox and other gifts!



Parent-Child Read Alouds in Libraries!

With plenty of engaging books, City libraries are hosting various events for different ages, such as read-alouds or *kamishibai* (paper art storytelling)!



Bike Parking: Supporting Families Going Out for a Stroll!

A wider bike-parking zone has been set up for bicycles with child seats. Free on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, for parents and children under JHS age!

School Commuting Passes Now Subsidized!



Commuter passes will be fully subsidized for students residing in Kobe City and commuting to local senior high schools (public & private) starting this fiscal year.

Eligible Persons: •Students (under 18 years old) attending one of the following types of schools, and residing within Kobe City during the eligibility period. (See further details in link)

Eligible Types of Schools:

- Senior high schools (full-time; fixed-term, night school; distance learning)
- · Vocational schools / International schools
- · Secondary education schools (upper secondary courses)

Eligible Period of Subsidy: April | 2024~March 3| 2025 (|2 months)

How to Apply (Tentative): Parents or guardians must submit an online application.

Application period: Early January 2025~ Early April 2025

*A photo of the commuter pass used during the eligibility period must be submitted with your application.

**Train tickets, discount tickets, Shinkansen or express train tickets will not be covered.

*Please buy a commuter pass for the most economic route that incurs minimal cost.

- ·First Package: 10,000JPY worth of baby-care goods
- •Packages #2~10: 3,000JPY worth of baby-care goods (per package)

COVID-19 Vaccinations For Elderly and At-Risk Residents

Routine COVID-19 vaccinations will be administered from Tuesday, October | 2024 to Friday, January 3 | 2025.

- ⇒The following eligible persons may receive a vaccination for 3000.JPY:
 - · Persons 65 years old and over
- · Persons between 60 and 65 years old, who are immunocompromised, or have a heart/kidney/respiratory disorder.
- ⇒Persons who fall under any of the following categories may receive a vaccination for free:
 - ① Households receiving public assistance
 - 2 Households exempt from residence tax
 - ③ Persons who are issued a Pollution Medical Handbook by Kobe City
 - Beneficiaries of the Support System for Japanese Nationals Remaining in China

XYou will need to show certification as proof of eligibility.

How to Get Vaccinated:

Please bring your health insurance card, MyNumber card, or other personal identification, and fill out a COVID Vaccination Application Form at hospitals and clinics where the vaccine is available.

**Taking both the COVID and influenza vaccinations at once may be possible only if a physician deems it necessary.
